## MEDICAL SERVICE MADE FINE RECORD IN RECENT RETREAT

All Wounded Were Safely Removed From Enemy's Clutches.

AN ATLANTIC PORT, May 31.—A British medical mission, representing the British Medical Society, arrived here today to attend the American Congress of Medical Societies, to be held in Chicago June 10. The members include Sir James Mackenzie, Sir Arthur Lane and Col. Herbert A. Bruce, consulting surgeon of the British army in France. The British surgeons will tell the congress of their experiences in the war, of their failures and successes, and of the medical problems to be met in dealing with the wounded and the health of armies. Col. Bruce, who was formerly at the University of Toronto, completed a visit to the advanced hospitals at the front before coming here. During the recent retreat, though tremendous difficulties were imposed on the medical service, the wounded were all safely removed to hospitals in the rear, and none was allowed to fall into the hands of the enemy. The nursing and medical personnel also escaped, though unfortunately suffering some casualties. "I found," Col. Bruce said, "everywhere among the British officers and men at the front a spirit of quiet confidence in being able to withstand any attack of the enemy and a stern determination to hold the line at all costs until the arrival of sufficiently large reinforcements from America to insure complete and final victory."

## Female Swindler Claims Brantford as Her Home Town

Margaret Kennedy Will Be Sentenced at Windsor on Monday.

WINDSOR, May 31.—Dressed in the height of fashion and apparently confident of acquittal of the charges against her, Miss Margaret Kennedy, alias Mrs. Ben Conley, appeared in Judge Dromgole's court at Sandwich today, but right away she found herself in trouble. For Crown Attorney Reid forced her to admit that she had been once convicted in Detroit for larceny, had been arrested in Windsor two years ago for swindling, and was also in bad standing with the authorities at Battle Creek, Mich.

The young woman, who declares she is a daughter of Levi Kennedy of Brantford, said she was married when only 16 to Benjamin Conley, who is now a United States army officer. She is now divorced. Judge Dromgole found her guilty of fraudulently obtaining several articles of jewelry and an automobile from Windsor business firms by issuing worthless checks in payment. She will be sentenced Monday.

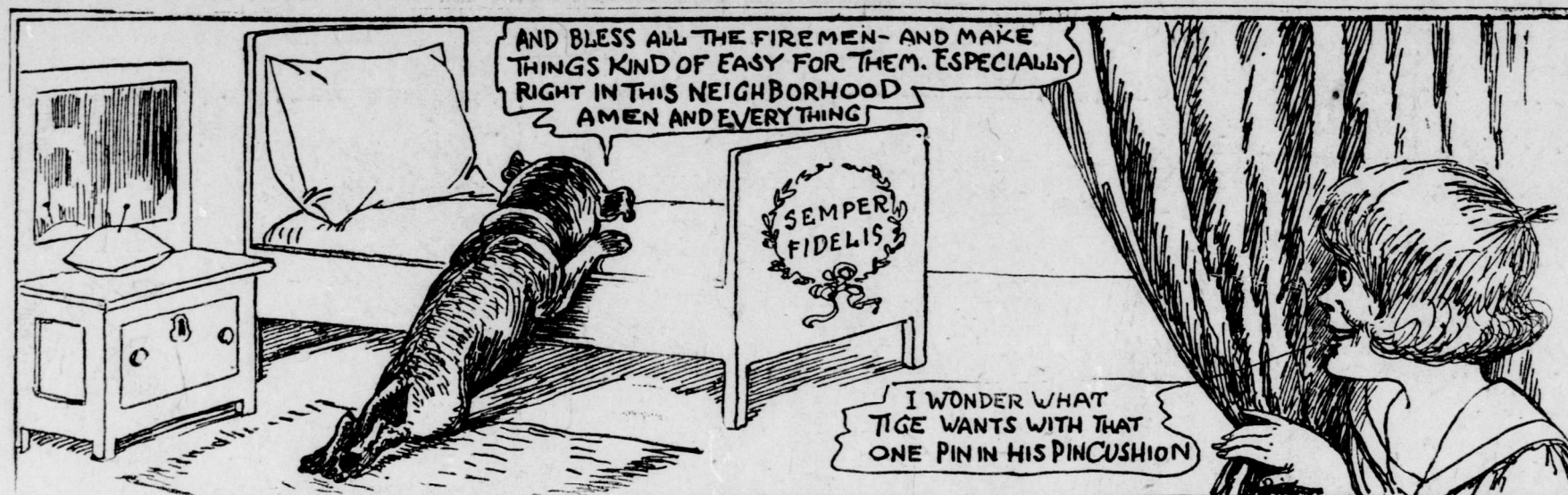

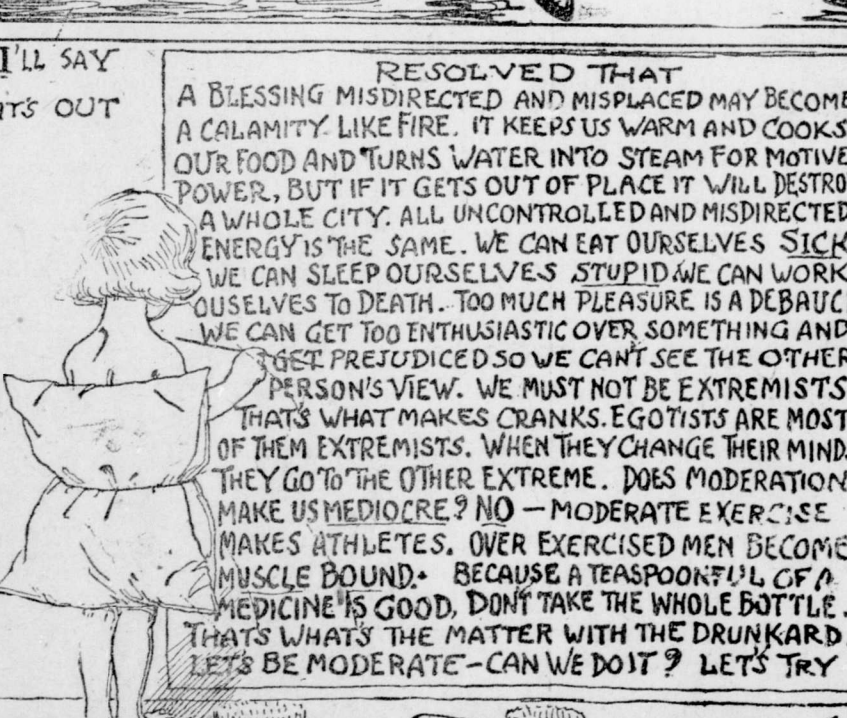
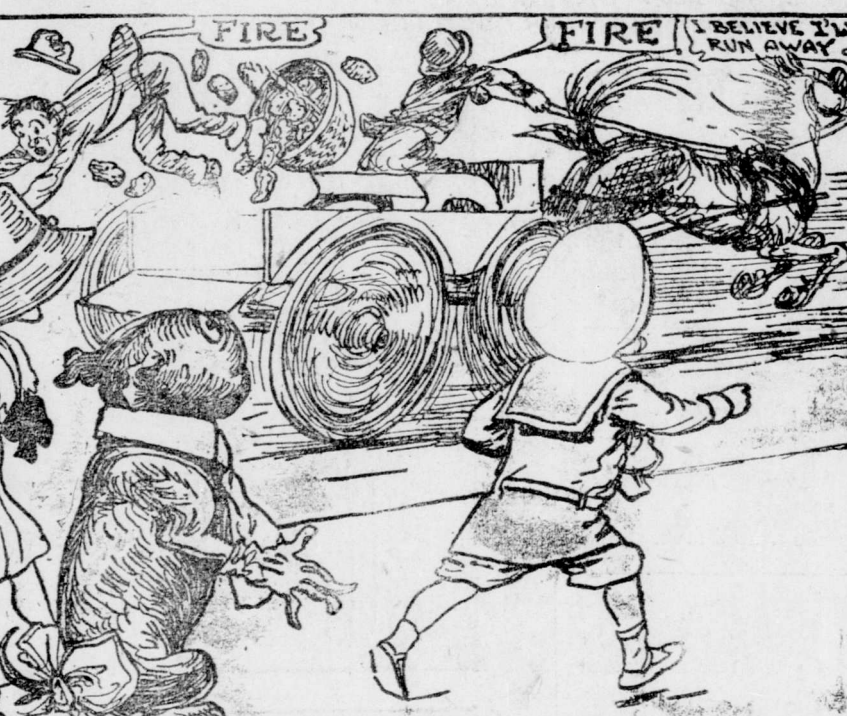
