The half yearly statement of earnings of the London and Port Stanley from July 1 to December 31st, has been ssued by the commission, showing the estimated profits to be \$31,896.68, as compared with \$4,329.34 for the corresponding period of 1915. compared with \$4,329.34 for the corresponding period of 1915.

The gross earnings were \$178,211.75, as compared with \$139,171 for the first six months of the previous year, an advance of approximately \$39,000.

The operating expenses were figured at \$193,633.65, as compared with \$98,296.72 for 1915.

The other expenses were \$42,687.42, composed as follows: Bond interest, \$24,197.40; sinking fund, \$4,740; rental, \$10,000.02, and taxes, \$3,750. 
