SEATS IN HOUSE DENIED TO WOMEN

Premier Gives Rowell's Bill Removing Disqualification Six Months' Hoist.

An amendment to give women the right to run for election to the provincial legislature was introduced and lost by N. W. Rowell in the legislature last night.

Mr. Rowell's argument was that as sex was no longer a disqualification for voting the natural thing to do was to remove the sex disqualification which now prevents women from being candidates for membership in the house.

The recognized principle was that any voter was eligible for which he had the vote. There was no need to change this principle. The only logical thing to do was to extend it to women.

Mr. Rowell's bill would have given women the right to vote in the election of members of the provincial legislature. It was defeated by a vote of 18 to 12.

BILLS ARE WITHDRAWN ON MEDICAL OFFICERS

Municipalities Cannot Discharge Them Without Consent of Government.

A number of bills introduced by private members were given their second readings in the house yesterday afternoon. Two bills regarding medical health officers, one to give the municipalities power to discharge them, and the other to give county judges the right to settle disputes regarding their salaries, were withdrawn.

H. B. Dewar withdrew his bill to give members of parliament power to examine and N. O. books as the commissioners, and to make it illegal for members to enter into contracts with governments, commissions, or other bodies.

L. F. Hilliard withdrew his bill to appeal to the county judge in case of dispute over salary between municipal health officers and the board of health.

TEACHERS' PENSIONS BILL IS INTRODUCED

Province and Teachers Will Each Pay Two and Half Per Cent. of Salary Bill.

Hon. Dr. Pyne introduced his teachers' superannuation bill in the legislature last night. In explaining the main points of the bill, the minister of education said that teachers would pay two and one-half per cent. of their salaries and the province two and one-half per cent. of the total salary bill of the province.

Teachers could receive annuities, starting at a time of service and shall receive from 30 to 40 years' service. The annuities would vary from a minimum of \$95 to a maximum of \$1000.

A very delightful concert was held last evening at the Toronto Conservatory of Music, in behalf of Mrs. Agar Adamson's Belgian children's relief fund. The program was arranged by Miss Lina Adamson, and it proved to be of the highest artistic interest.

Justice Latchford has given judgment against the Canadian Order of Home Circles, in favor of Mrs. H. H. Rushbrook, for \$18.67, with interest from May 1, 1916, and full costs upon the supreme court scale.

REDUCE TYPHOID FEVER

The department of militia and defence has announced that for the 12 months ending Dec. 31, 1916, 167 cases of typhoid fever were reported in Canada, and that the disease is especially affecting young adults from 17 to 30 years of age.
