There was a steady but quiet market out at the Union Stock Yards yesterday, the receipts being only about 300 cattle, together with an ordinary Tuesday run of small stuff, being in striking contrast to Monday's big rush, the largest of the season.

But the 400 head of fresh stuff added to about 350 left overs from Monday made quite a fair run, which was, however, well cleaned up in good time. There were none of the extra choice lots of export cattle on hand, which marked Monday's trading, and for which fancy prices were paid, but a lot of good useful to inferior cattle, all of which, however, went out.

Fair to good butcher cattle held steady and a feature of the market, which is becoming more apparent every day, is the improved demand for the better grades of stockers and feeders, and the firmer prices quoted yesterday fully 4c better than a week ago. This is attributable in a great part to the splendid outlook for pasture and coarse grains all over, drovers from all parts of Ontario who came on the market stating that there will be an abundance of feed of all kinds.

There was a good strong calf trade yesterday for all but the grassers. Real choice calwes sold at from 14c to 15c, with a few extra ones at 18c. There was a good sheep and lamb trade as stated with the close at from 14c to 144c, and extra lambs brought 144c.

Higher prices on the Buffalo market and a light run of nogs gave them another boost of from 30c to 40c per cwt., as high as \$17.75 being paid fed and watered. Predictions are being made trat hogs will reach \$18 within a fortnight, but this remains to be seen. Taken altogether Tuesday's market was a pretty good one, and generally satisfactory all round.
