APRIL 21.—A statement of receipts was submitted, shewing that the income for 1871 would probably be equal to that of 1870.

MAY 26.—A draft of the 33rd Annual Report was submitted; after an amendment it was adopted and ordered to be printed, as usual.

JUNE 16.—On the recommendation of the Block Sum Committee, a grant of \$250 from the "ninth reduction" for *new work* in Falmouth was approved. Also, the proposal of Rev. J. Forsyth, viz.: to reside where he may think fit, and to pay \$200 toward support of a clergyman at Londonderry Mines and \$100 to Truro, retaining \$200.

It was agreed that the General Annual Meeting of the Society be held during the last week in August next.
