DearSisir;-

I am enclosing herewith copy of the estimated cost of the very necessary repairs and alterations found to be absolutely nessary to the buildings now, and which have been doing duty as an Indian Industrial School at Kamloops for these many years.

In accordance with your instructions under date of the 23rd Ultime, I paid an Official visit to the Industrial School on the 3rd inst, and in company with the Superintendent of the Institution I made an inspection of the interior of the buildings and from what presented themselves in the entire inadquacy of the present interior arrangements to meet the requirements of sucha worthy Institution, I realized how utterly incompetent I was to transcribe on paper what is really needed to bring up this Institution to any thing like modern requirements of such a School.

Acting therefore on your suggestion for an expert report on existing conditions, needed alterations and approximate cost of carrying out the same. I engaged the service of Mr J. Parlett a competent Architect with a lucretive business in this City to examine and report on the same, the result of his labours is herewith enclosed.

I might therefore add that the alterations and additions recommended by him are deemed in my humble opinion to be absolutely necessary to bring up the buildings to some thing near what the requirements of a buildings used for that purpose should be. After going through the interior of the buildings and viewing the conveniences provided, the wender is, how the staff have managed to succeed as well as they have without serious
