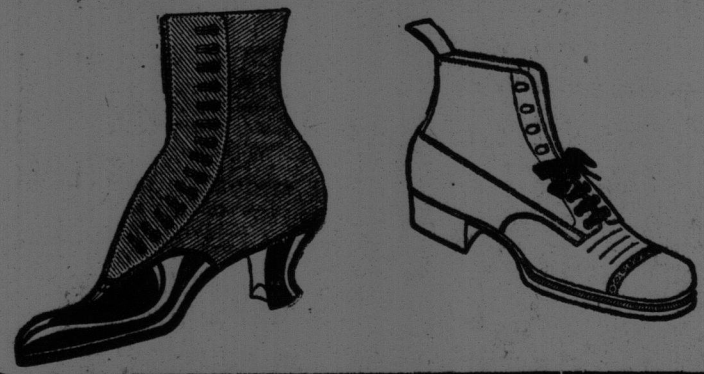

CANADA IN THE WAR

The Canadian casualty list published today shows eleven men wounded from the Princess Pats, the 7th, 10th and 14th Battalions.

Lance Corporal O'Leary, a Canadian, has been awarded the Victoria Cross for gallantry in action. He is reported to have rushed to the front, killed five Germans himself, captured three more Germans and captured two.

Dr. Michael Clark of Red Deer, Alta., received congratulations in parliament yesterday on the bravery of his son who

is with the Princess Patricia's, took part in much of their recent fighting and came through unscathed. Dr. Clark had just received a personal message of congratulation from the O. C. of the unit in the trenches, upon the work of his son.

HOUSING BILL IS DEFEATED

Renewal of Grants Refused—Both
Rejected on Mayor's Deciding
Vote—Aid For Parks—New
Brass Foundry

Mayor Frink was called upon to use his casting vote on two resolutions at yesterday's council meeting, by it defeating Commissioner Potts' motion for a city housing scheme and Commissioner Wigmore's resolution for a restoration of 75 per cent of the civic grants to charitable institutions and others. Expenditure of money was involved in each case, although the mayor himself came out strongly in opposition to the restoration of any portion of the grants. The council decided to take no action on the petition of business men asking the withdrawal of the bill now before the legislature exempting incomes up to \$1,000 from taxation.

The report of the commissioner of water and sewerage on awarding of the tender for 185 tons of cast iron, made-in-Canada ten-inch pipe at \$31.75 a ton was adopted.

The vote of \$800 to the town planning commission for preliminary work, unexpended last year, was re-voted. Ellen E. Plaglor, on recommendation of Commissioner Russell, was granted renewal of lot No. 464, Queens ward, for seven years at an advance of 30 per cent in the rental.

A recommendation for a lease of lot 4, Block L, Britain street, to Messrs. Hogan, Eagles & Sterling as a site for a brass foundry at \$40 a year was laid over on the protest of Commissioners Potts and McLellan that the city might need this lot for storage and other purposes.

John Jackson was granted right to collect revenues from North and South Market wharves at \$1,000.

Francis Kerr's communication asking payment of \$50 on behalf of John McCarthy, of Simonds street, for boarding a horse since December, was referred to the commissioner of public safety. The latter reported the recorder had given the opinion that the city was not liable.

Daniel Mullin, K. C., wrote asking payment of a claim of \$9.80 for four days' pay, alleged to be due George H. Clark at the time the latter left the police force and the matter went to the commissioner of public safety.

The mayor introduced a motion which he declared was not a compromise, authorizing legislation to make compulsory assessing for not less than \$4,000 for the Rockwood Park and for \$250 for Riverview Park each year. In St. John, having resided here for several years as a member of the staff of S. Arcott & Company.

Mrs. Thomas Fitzsimmons died in Lakerville on March 19 in her ninety-third year. She was a survivor of the Miramichi fire. Four sons survive, also thirty four grand children and thirty-three great grandchildren.

Mrs. P. C. Martin, of Grand Falls, died at her home Tuesday after a short illness from typhoid fever. Besides her husband and two small children she is survived by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Michael, and several sisters. The funeral will take place Thursday.

Mrs. John Tucker of Hopewell Hill, died at her home Monday. A few days previous she stepped on a pitchfork. It was rusty and blood poisoning set in, death resulting. Besides her husband she is survived by three sons and three daughters.

GERMAN SOLDIERS DRIVEN INSANE

London, March 24.—Driven insane by British artillery fire, which mowed down their comrades, 800 German infantrymen were removed to an asylum near Aix-la-Chapelle after the battle of Neuve Chapelle, according to a despatch from Amsterdam to the Exchange Telegraph Company. MORNING NOTES OF THE WAR

The Turks have made another unsuccessful attack on the Suez Canal, accompanied by German officers.

Libel proceedings have been instituted by the United States against the German steamer Odenwald which tried to leave San Juan without orders and destroyers have been ordered to guard her and another Hamburg-American liner, the President.

Bad weather at the Dardanelles has caused somewhat of a lull in the progress of the Allies' fleet.

There is still no authentic story concerning the reported loss of the German raider "Karlshof." The evidence that

she sank after striking a reef is believed in the West Indies to have been "planted" by the Germans.

The Russian fleet is active in the Black Sea, and several Turkish forts in Asia Minor have been bombarded.

The British steamer Pandion from Rotterdam on arrival at Southampton, England yesterday, reported having been attacked by a German aeroplane and seven bombs dropped upon her.

The Italians are fortifying the Dodecanese Islands, in the Aegean Sea, and steamers are taking munitions there.

Bulgaria talks of forming a coalition cabinet in case of departing from her neutral policy.

Before the enemy gave up Przemysl, 40,000 men are said to have been killed by the Russians. Thousands within the

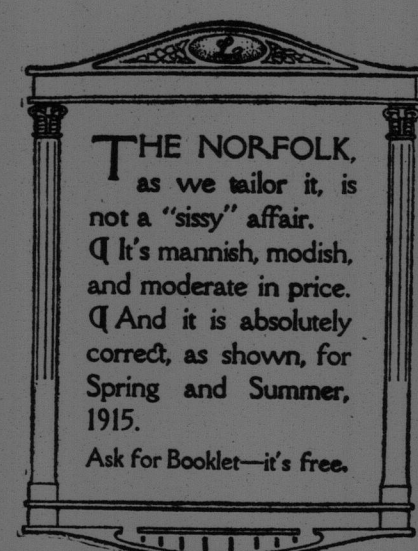
garrison were suffering from disease. When the fortress gave in some 120,000 surrendered.

Major Gault of Upper Canada, is slated to command the Princess Patricia's at the front while Capt. Adamson of Toronto will probably command until Major Gault recovers from his wounds.
