A general discussion of the matter then took place, participated in by the chairman, Mr. Knight, C. B. Allen, Mr. Daniel and John Gillis.


After the meeting Mr. DesBrisay announced that he and Mr. Knight would confer over the matter of the committee and that their selection would be announced later.
