London, May 11-French troops ad vanced their line slightly last evening east of Locre, on the Flanders front. The war office statement follows: "French troops advanced their line slightly last evening east of Locre and aptured several prisoners. We carried out successful raids during the night west of Merville and brought back a few prisoners and machine guns. A raid attempted by the enemy east of Ypres was stopped by our fire."
