## Scholarships For Soldiers

Overseas Scheme Organized To Provide Higher Education For Discharged Soldiers — Thirty-Three Awarded

The Overseas Sailor and Soldier Scholarships scheme, which was organized a few months ago under the auspices of the Rhodes Trust and the Lord Kitchener National Memorial Fund, has so far progressed, says the London Morning Post, that thirty-three scholarships to Oxford, Cambridge and Edinburgh Universities and other educational centres have been awarded to officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the Dominion Forces in the following proportions: Australians, seventeen; Canadians, ten; New Zealanders, four; South Africans, one; Newfoundlanders, one. It is anticipated that the number will be largely augmented after the summer vacation. Although the scheme includes sailors as well as soldiers, no application for a scholarship has been received from or on behalf of the men of the Naval Services. It is also interesting to note that nearly half of the total number of nominees selected Oxford University for instructional purposes, the Imperial College of Science and Technology being next in favor.

The purpose of the fund is to enable members of the Overseas Forces who are unfit for further active service to undergo a course of higher educational training in Great Britain, provided they are nominated by the High Commissioners for the Dominions to which they belong and that they come within the following conditions: (a) Graduated at an Overseas University (b) had their studies at an overseas university interrupted by the call to service; (c) passed examinations of university entrance standard, but have not attended a university; (d) had practically no education since leaving school at an early age, but have developed considerable character and power of thought and would benefit greatly by a course of study at a university; (e) attended technical schools

or been engaged in occupations demanding a high standard of technical knowledge. The naval or military status of a scholar may be that of a retired officer or discharged man, or an officer or man still serving and (a) on leave and in receipt of pay, or (b) on leave without pay. The universities and technical schools have intimated that they will welcome such students and will provide one-year courses of study designed for their special needs.

The scholarships which are of the annual value of £150 to £250 each, according to the university, college or school selected, are calculated amply to cover the expenses of tuition and other fees and the cost of living. Of the total number of scholarships awarded to date the Kitchener Memorial Fund has provided the funds for nineteen impartially distributed over the universities and technical schools of England and Scotland and the Rhodes Trust, eleven (all for Oxford University); Otto Belt, two (both for the Imperial College of Science and Technology; of which he is governor); and Sir Robert Kindersley, one (Oxford). The institutions selected by students and to which the scholarships have been allocated are as follows: Oxford University, thirteen; Cambridge University, two; Edinburgh University, four; Manchester University, two; Birmingham University, three; London University, (King's College), one; Imperial College of Science and Technol-

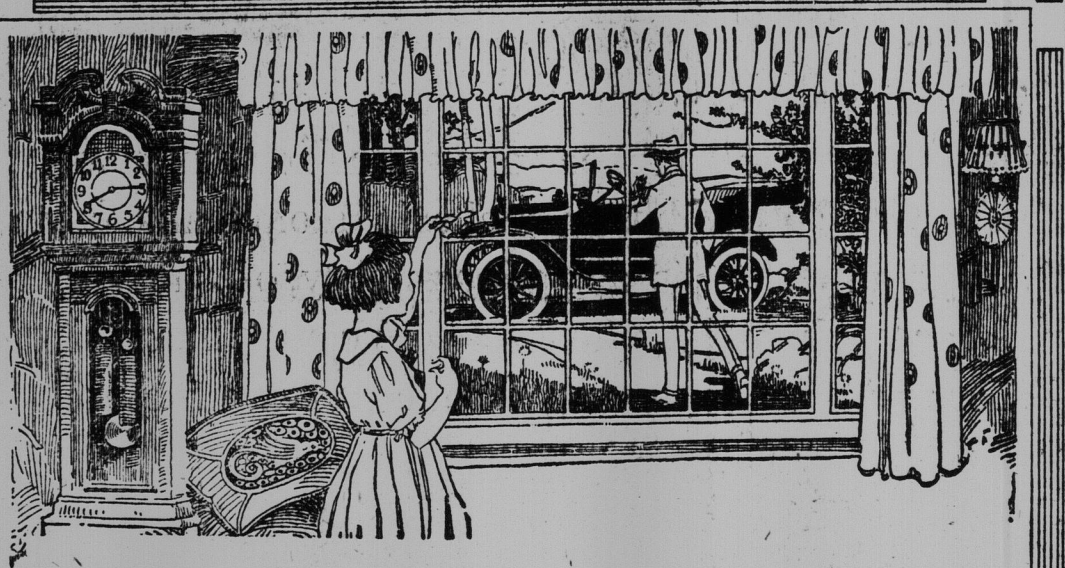

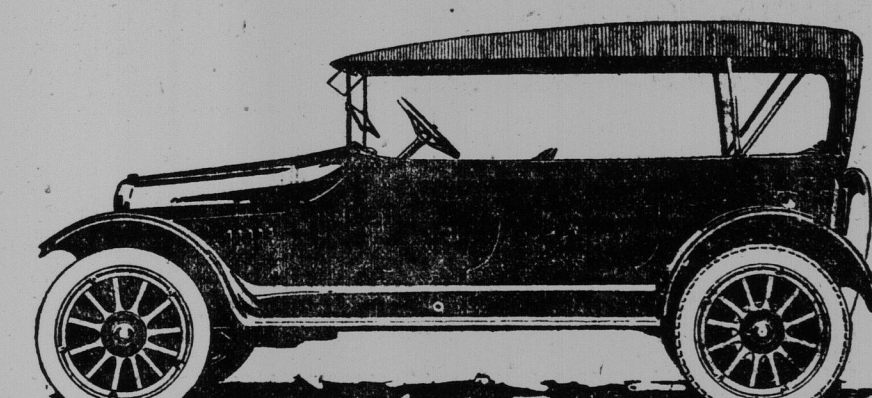

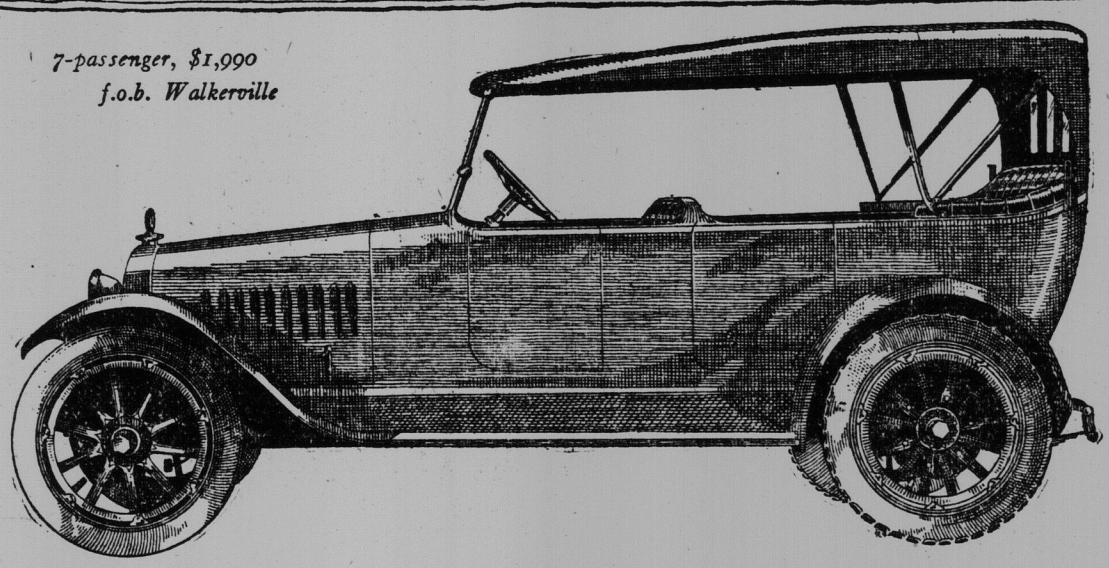
