TO COMPLETE VALLEY RAILWAY BY AUTUMN

On Tuesday of this week, Premier Foster, accompanied by C. O. Foss, chief engineer, and E. S. Carter, secretary-treasurer of the St. John & Quebec Railway, and B. M. Hill, government inspecting engineer, made a trip by automobile from St. John as far as Gagetown and had an excellent opportunity of observing what progress was being made in the construction work on the Valley line.

The determination of the Railway Company and the government that the road shall be completed this fall was conveyed some time ago to the Nova Scotia Construction Company, and quite recently was embodied in an agreement which the company and the government asked the Nova Scotia Construction Company to enter into to the effect that if the railway is not completed by a certain date in the month of November, the company will forfeit to the government asked to cover any interest charges and engineering expenses for which the province would be liable. This about \$300 a day would represent the interest upon the total expenditure on the Gagetown-Westfield section. At the present moment the Construction Company are making every possible effort to avoid paying this penalty and the prospects are that the road will be completed sufficiently ready for operation by the Canadian Government Railway before winter sets in.


