He essays great things, and if his daring is sometimes greater than his success he certainly fails nobly. I find Roberts' 'Child of the Infinite' one of the most remarkable poems that have come out of Canada. It is full of fire and vigor, and if I still think it a trifle rhetorical, it is a rhetoric for which he may well plead precedent. "Canadian poetry has just sustained a very serious loss in the death of Marjorie Pickthall. A full, rich, fancy, tribution to literature, makes her work very notable. 





