Once he feels better he'll get up. On the Twenty-Eighth he was still in his room in his pyjamas.

Q.40? Can you tell me what time of day that was?
A.40? I always made my traps to Leer in the morning. It would be before noon.

The witness is cross-examined by the Prosecutor:

Q.408	Captain Fassina, you stated, did you not, that someone had informed you on Monday evening, the Twenty-Fifth, that
A.408	Captain Jessop was not feeling well. Ies, that he wasn't feeling well.
Q.409	So that you went round the morning of the Twanty-Sixth and saw him. Correct?
A.409	Ies sir.
Q.410	Not Wonday evening after dirner? It was definitely the Twenty-Sixth?
A.410	Tuesday the Twenty-Sixth.
Q.411 A.411	When you got round to his room, Captain Jessop was in bed? In his pyjamas.
Q.412 A.432	Was he in bed? Sitting around in his room.
Q.413 A.413	What complaint did he make to you? That he wasn't feeling very well.
Q.414 A.414	Did you take his temperature? Yes sir.
Q.415 A.415	And was he suffering from fever?
Q.416 A.416	No fever. What diagnosis did you make? Simple cold.
Q.417	Simple cold. Did you mention anything about it being a slight case of flu?
A.417	Yes sir. The reason he should go to bed is that sometimes it develope jaundice.
Q.418	Now, you have said you saw Captain Jessop and ordered him to remain in bed for the rest of the week. Correct?
A.418	Yes sir.
Q.419	Do you imply from that that up until the Twenty-Eighth - that is from the Twenty-Sixth to the Twenty-Eighth he was more or less a bed patient?
A.419	No sir, I would say confined to his room.
Q.420 A.420	But not actually in bed? Not all the time in bed. He was in his pyjamas.
Q.421 A.421	In pyjamas, but not actually in bed? Not totally in bed.
Q.422	In other words he wasn't sick in bed to be confined completely to his bed and waited on hand and foot. He could get around.
A.422	He wasn't a dying man.

Q.423 No. Far from it. With a slight cold --President: You are introducing evidence there --

Pros: I'm serry.

The Prosecutor continues with the cross-examination of the witness:
