Q.414 Did you take his temperature?
A.414 Yes sir.

Q.415 And was he suffering from fever?
A.415 No sir.

Q.416 No fever. What diagnosis did you make?
A.416 Simple cold.

Q.417 Simple cold. Did you mention anything about it being a slight case of flu?

A.417 Yes sir. The reason he should go to bed is that sometimes it develops jaundice.

Q.418 Now, you have said you saw Captain Jessop and ordered him to remain in bed for the rest of the week. Correct?
A.418 Yes sir.

Q.419 Do you imply from that that up until the Twenty-Eighth - that is from the Twenty-Sixth to the Twenty-Eighth he was more or less a bed patient?

A.419 No sir, I would say confined to his room.

Q.420 But not actually in bed?
A.420 Not all the time in bed. He was in his pyjamas.

Q.421 In pyjamas, but not actually in bed?
A.421 Not totally in bed.

Q.422 In other words he wasn't sick in bed to be confined completely to his bed and waited on hand and foot. He could get around. He wasn't a dying man.

Q.423 No. Far from it. With a slight cold --
