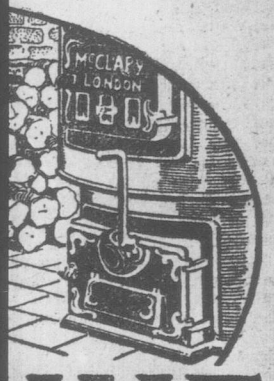

ORGANIZED FOR A
SIDNEY CREAMERY

An Association Formed Which Will
Seek to Bring Butter Factory
There.

A meeting has been held in Sidney
to consider the advisability of starting
a new creamery or inducing the Vic-
toria Creamery to locate at that place.
After thoroughly discussing the matter
the Sidney Creamery Association was
launched with a provisional board com-
prising of Samuel Fairclough, president;
M. A. Thomas, secretary; Alexander
McDonald, William Armstrong, Mark
Hewitt, Julius Brethour, John Breth-
our, Samuel Brethour and Henry
Brethour provisional directors.

The secretary was instructed to get
all possible data, and visit various
islands, Maple Bay and Cowichan to
find out the number of cows and pa-
trons that could be assured and to look
after subscriptions for stock. It was
also present were in favor of affilia-
tion with the Victoria Creamery if lo-
cated at Sidney, but if not to build a
new creamery on the islands and
Saatchi, directors to be divided equally
among the various districts. It was
found suitable arrangements could be
made for steamers connecting with the
islands, Maple Bay and Cowichan,
which would be of considerable advan-
tage to the creamery.

A private party wished to offer to
erect a creamery at Sidney, and run it
as a private concern but a joint co-
operative association was considered of
more value to the farmers.

IMPORTANT DECISION.

Norton Entitled to Be Heard on Ap-
plication for Renewal of Tim-
ber License.

A Times special dispatch from Otta-
wa says: "Judgment has been given in
the Supreme Court of Canada in the
following British Columbia cases, Nor-
ton vs. Fulton, allowed with costs; Elk
Lumber Co. vs. Crow's Nest Pass Co.,
appeal dismissed with costs."

The first of these cases has had a
very interesting course. The local gov-
ernment issued Mr. Norton a timber li-
cense. Mr. Norton later claiming a re-
newal of it. The government disputed
his right to this renewal and Norton
requested a petition of right and want-
ed to have the question tried out in
court as to whether he was legally en-
titled to renewal. The provincial sec-
retary, Hon. F. J. Fulton, acting for
the government, refused to allow the
question to be decided by the courts
and refused the petition of right.

Mr. Norton then commenced his ac-
tion, claiming the provincial secretary
had no right to deny him this accession
to the courts and that his action in re-
fusing to submit the petition to the
Lieutenant-governor was an illegal act
of obstruction. Mr. Norton sued for
damages. The trial came on in July
last before a special jury but the trial
judge ruled that Mr. Norton had no
case and withdrew the case from the
jury and dismissed the action. Mr.
Norton then appealed to the full court.
Mr. Justice Irving was of the opinion
that Mr. Norton had a good cause of
action against the department and that
he was entitled to have it tried before a
jury, the other members of the court,
the Chief Justice and Mr. Justice Mar-
tin were of the opposite opinion, the
result being that Mr. Norton's appeal
before the full court of British Colum-
bia was dismissed. Mr. Norton then
appealed to the Supreme Court of Can-
ada where he was successful. Mr. Jus-
tice Irving's dissenting opinion being
upheld by the Supreme Court of Can-
ada.

The word "calamity" is derived from
