found several letters from "A. B. Sheraton," of Dalhousie, advising him to get out and to keep clear of the authorities. The letters advised him to make it clear why Chiverton should have been arrested. Descriptive papers, when he heard of these facts, reported the Chiverton letters and came to the conclusion that they were in the handwriting of Postmaster Johnson of Dalhousie, and that the signature "A. B. Sheraton" was a fictitious one.

Chiverton was closely questioned, and it is alleged made a confession that it was he who had robbed the Dalhousie post office. In his confession he is alleged to have declared that he was put up to the crime by postmaster Johnson, with whom he divided the money.

On the strength of this confession, Sergeant Chamberlain was sent back to Dalhousie and arrested Mr. Johnson on Saturday 7th. The prisoner at once engaged Mr. W. A. Mott to defend him, and a request was made for bail, as the case was not to be tried until the 17th.

When Detective Carpenter learned that Mr. Johnson was at liberty he decided to make a second arrest on the more serious charge of carrying a dangerous weapon.

It is understood that the address on the package was in a boyish or well disguised hand. It is believed that there will be difficulty in connecting Mr. Johnson with it, and it may not even be possible to clearly establish that the package was mailed in New Brunswick.

Johnson is about 30 years of age, and has a wife, a former Minotia lady, and two children. He is a son of Mr. H. A. Johnson the former postmaster of Dalhousie, who was the late John Fotheringham.

Johnson is said to have been in charge of the liquor traffic, regardless of a well known fact that he had never been in the town.

A Dalhousie despatch of 15th inst.—R. J. Chamberlain of the Dominion police arrived here this morning from Ottawa, where he was detailed over. Mr. Chiverton, arrested at Rex Porage, charged with an attempt at murder by poisoning. He is supposed to be implicated in the Dalhousie post office robbery and is to be the principal witness against the accused. Johnson, Chiverton is a native of Miramichi and has resided with his parents here during late years.

Chiverton is a son of Benjamin Chiverton who once lived here, but has, for a good many years, resided in Dalhousie. His uncle, whose name is the prisoner, is a well known and respected resident of the Bastibouche settlement.

The preliminary hearing of the case against postmaster Johnson for stealing from the post office, which took place at Dalhousie on Tuesday, Chiverton gave testimony showing that Johnson had, last summer, suggested the robbery to him, and that he had agreed to get into the post office and to hand over the money to Johnson.

Johnson admitted all, called no witnesses and was committed for trial which is to take place on 24th inst.

In regard to the charge against Johnson of sending poisoned candy through the mails, application was made for a remand until the 22nd as the Crown witnesses from Northern Ontario have not arrived, it was granted.
