This omission from the New Testament of the sacrificing priest as a title of the minister must be because it was the mind of the Holy Ghost that it should not be used. Positively the primary aim of the ministry may be briefly expressed in the phrase, "A ministry of reconciliation," for the diffusion of God's message of love, peace, and reconciliation.
