VICTORIA.

The general situation continues to show signs of gradual improvement. The late advances in prices of staple products has had a tendency to promote business, which is also favorably affecting other lines. The success of the British Colum bia Loan on the London market will, it is believed, in a measure assist in interesting capital in the natural resources of the province. The coast catches of the sealers have been disappointing to those engaged in that industry.

The great developments now going on in both Kootenay and Cariboo mining districts are creating an increased demand for merchandise of all kinds.

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES.

Washington naval oranges are about over and prices are 50c higher. Mediterranean sweets are now on the market. California lemons have advanced. The Miowera brought 127 crates bananas and 3 crates pine apples which met with a fair demand. Bananas are much cheaper. Oregon and Washington strawberries are expected to commence arriving shortly.
