HAY, ROBERT. (*Centre Toronto.*)

B. in Perthshire, Scot.; emigrated to Can. in 1831. M. 18 Nov. 1949, Mary, only dau. of Thomas Dunlop (she d. 1871.) Has been a manufacturer of cabinet furniture 44 years. A dir. of the Credit Valley Railway. First returned to Parlt at last g.e. In politics, a Baldwin Reformer, but along with a great many others, became convinced that the late Government were pursuing a policy detrimental to the best interests of the country, and, along with an overwhelming majority of the electors of the Dominion, declared in favor of a National Policy. In favor of a Prohibitory Liquor Law when practicable.—*Toronto, Ont.*

HESSON, SAMUEL ROLLIN, J.P. (*North Perth.*)

Parents both born in Irel.; came to Can. in 1832. Mother's name was Dunbar, and grandmother's, Wallace. B. in Co. Antrim, Irel., 1829. Ed. at the Dundas, Ont., Grammar School. M. 21 Nov. 1855, at Simcoe, Ont. Miss M. L. Polley, eld. dau. of John Polley, Esq., founder of Simcoe. Was Postmaster of Sebringville for 7 years. Apptd. J.P. for the Co. of Perth 22 years ago. A general merchant. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Conservative, strongly impressed with the advantages of a Protective or National Policy to this young Dominion.—*Stratford, Ont.*

HILLIARD, GEORGE. (*West Peterboro'.*)

Fifth s. of the late Lieut.-Col. Hilliard, of Her Majesty's 5th Regiment. B. at Morrisburgh, Co. of Dundas, in May 1827. M. Eliza, third dau. of the Hon. Jonathan Gove, of Acworth, New Hampshire, U.S. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e.—*Peterboro', Ont.*
