

Peaceful Beehives tame Aurora Tigers

There are two trains of thought regarding fighting in hockey. One group believes that any fisticuffs detract from the skill of the sport; the other side claims a good scrap makes a good hockey game.

The last two Sunday nights at Dixie Arena have been virtually devoid of pugilism - unlike most of the Dixie Beehive home games - and the result has been rather dull hockey.

After a week long Christmas layoff the Beehives coasted for 30 minutes Sunday night, let the Aurora Tigers take a 2-1 lead and then slowly took command

of the game, winning 5-2. The win left Dixie in second place two points behind North York.

The Bees skated out in the first period just an edge slower than the visiting club. Aurora the ninth place team in the Metro 'B' league worked hard to pop in two goals during the period.

Terry Casey and Wolf Hiesel scored for the Tigers in the first period. In between their markers, Vic Stanfield drove one home for Dixie with Bruce Kirbyson assisting.

The pace quickened in the second period. The Bees kept the pressure on and the result was the tying goal at 9:01. John Stainton took a pass from Larry Patey, slipped in front of the net, and tucked the puck past Aurora netminder Doug Hutchinson.

The Bees took the lead two minutes later on a quick goal from a faceoff to the right of the Aurora net. Jim Glover won the face off and flipped the puck to Dick Decloe who snapped a quick wrist shot past Hutchinson.

Dixie completely dominated play for the rest of the period but some classy goaltending from Hutchinson, in the Aurora nets held them out.

In the third period the

Beehives continued to carry the play and at 11:37 Glenn Campbell picked up the insurance goal. Standing unmolested in front of the Aurora goal he tipped in Vic Stanfield's drive from the point. Stainton also

picked up an assist on the play.

The final goal was scored with only 13 seconds remaining. Aurora had pulled its goalie in favour of a sixth attacker but it backfired as Glenn Campbell

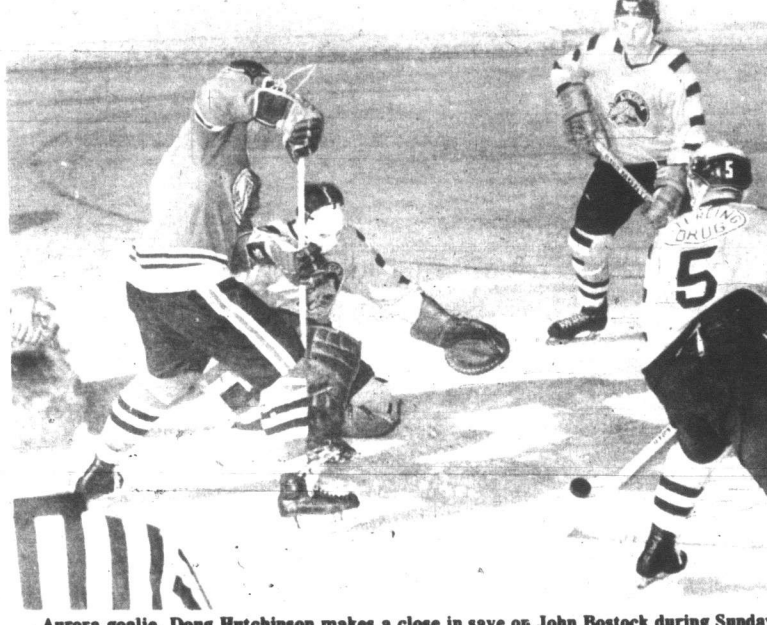
snagged a loose puck and fed it up to Dick Decloe. Decloe spotted Roger Hunt on the right wing and flipped him a nice pass to leave him with a wide open net. Hunt made no mistake on the 25 foot wrist shot.

The improvements are slight every week, but it's becoming obvious that the Bees are shaping into the championship team they were last year. Their passing is getting sharper every week, they're skating strongly, and they're not picking up the useless penalties they did earlier in the season.

They picked up only seven penalties to Aurora's nine on Sunday night.

The Beehives' next game is a return match with Aurora on Friday in Aurora. St. Michaels come to Dixie Arena on Sunday night.

Notes: The Bees' Christmas Party last week was apparently a great success, but a practise the next morning destroyed any delusions of high living. Vic Stanfield currently leads Dixie in scoring. Roger Hunt is second and Glen Campbell third.
