

required at the school; and as the equipment
 of the institution was not completed. The grant
 having been voted by Parliament, for the express
 purpose of completing the buildings, and furnishing
 the school, it was thought unwise to apply any
 portion of the grant, for expenditure which it
 was not designed to cover. When the Commissioner
 received this intimation, he at once applied for
 authority to allow the surplus for capital
 grant, for the first two quarters of the year,
 to be applied to the payment of pupils on
 the number 60, provided by the grant, who
 might be in attendance during the last
 two quarters of the year. This the Department
 acceded to, upon the condition that the grant
 for 80 pupils, submitted with the estimate for
 1892-93, should be passed by the House;
 and the payment is only delayed until such
 action
