The government therefore has shown its concern for the future welfare of the people of Canada not only in the measures designed to benefit them directly, but likewise in the part it has taken in international affairs.

You all know how extension of the mutual aid appropriation has been made to cover Canada's contribution to the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration.
