



At a Public Meeting of
the Inhabitants of Guelph and its neighbourhood, held at the Court House on Monday, the 9th of August, it was Resolved, that a Reward be offered for the party or parties, who so maliciously set fire to the Mills of Messrs. CLARKE & Co., on the morning of the 6th of August last. In accordance with the Resolutions passed at the above Meeting, the following Reward is offered,

**280 POUNDS
REWARD.**

WHEREAS, on the morn-

ing of Friday, now last past, a Mill belonging to William CLARKE and Henry ORTON, Esquires, of the Town of Guelph, in the District of Wellington, was destroyed by fire, and there is reason to suspect that the said fire was not occasioned by accident, but was the work of an Incendiary or Incendiaries. A Reward of £280 of lawful money, will be paid to any person or persons not being the actual offender or offenders, who will give such information as will lead to the discovery and conviction of the perpetrator or perpetrators of the said crime.

The above Reward will be paid in addition to whatever may be offered by the Government, and which will be increased by further subscriptions.
