Hence the only way to avoid them is to be prepared. For instance when buying a separator examine it closely, especially the bowl and see if it is simple or complicated; heavy or light; suspended or supported?



All supported bowls are fed at the top, requiring complicated interiors to assist separation. They are not only top heavy, but hard to clean and handle—due to their complicated mechanism. The three simple bowls on the right are

TUBULARS

Their simplicity and lightness are evident at a glance—they are easy to clean and handle. The Tubular bowl being suspended and bottom fed, necessitates but a simple smooth interior; because the milk passes but once through during the separation.
