The main question, as amended, was now put, the House again divided, and the names were taken down as follows:

RESOLVED, that the Bill to continue the Acts therein mentioned, refpecting Aliens, and certain subjects of His Majesty who have resided in *France*, coming into this Province, or residing therein, be read a second time on the twentieth March next.

Mr. Blanchet, from the Committee, to whom was referred the Petition of Thomas Alexis Goffelin, of the County of Hertford, reported, that the Committee had examined the matter of the faid petition, and had directed him to report their opinion thereon, to the House; and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered the same, in at the Clerk's table, where it was again read.

The faid report is as followeth; viz.

The Committee considering that the said Thomas Alexis Gosselin, or his predecessors, having built a bridge over the River Boyer, from which the public have derived the greatest advantage, and that the inhabitants of the parish of Saint Valier, have presented a petition in support of the one presented by the said Thomas Alexis Gosselin, and considering also that the inhabitants of the County of Devon, have presented a petition to the Grand Voyer, to build a bridge over the same River; the Committee is of opinion, that in justice to the said Thomas
