RESOLVED, that the Bill to continue the Acts therein mentioned, respecting Aliens, and certain subjects of His Majesty who have resided in *France*, coming into this Province, or residing therein, be read a second time on the twentieth March next.

Mr. *Blanchet*, from the Committee, to whom was referred the Petition of *Thomas Alexis Gosselin*, of the County of *Hertford*, reported, that the Committee had examined the matter of the said petition, and had directed him to report their opinion thereon, to the House; and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered the same, in at the Clerk's table, where it was again read.
