

With only twelve loads of stock at the Union Stock Yards to-day's was a sort of an off-day so far as a market was concerned. There were but very few buyers present, owing in part to the stormy weather and the difficulties in reaching the market with no car service at the Junction, as well as to the fact that most of the local wholesale butchers are already well supplied for the holiday trade. There is a market, however, this week for good butcher cattle, and a few good ones offering to-day went at good prices.

The hog market is steady and firm at last weeks quotations.

The run to-day was 12 carloads, with 193 head of cattle, 265 sheep and lambs, 25 hogs, and 19 calves.


