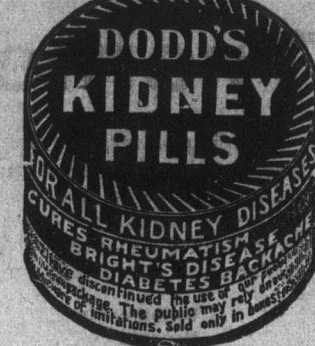

\$10,000 BAIL FOR GURFSKY.

SIXTY HOGS INFECTED.

Disheartening Discovery Just When Regulations Were Relaxing.

Chatham, Oct. 20.—News comes from the city that on Wednesday over sixty hogs were destroyed by Dr. Perdue on the farm of William Thompson, about three miles south of Blenheim, on account of the animals being infected with hog cholera.

An autopsy held on a number of the hogs revealed lesions of the disease, both in the acute and chronic form.

A few days ago the announcement was made that the regulations governing the shipments of hogs from this county, among others in this section, had been withdrawn and the situation now is a serious one.

A SHOCK FROM PERSIA

MUZAFFAR-ED-DIN GRANTS HIS PEOPLE A CONSTITUTION.

Dyed-in-the-Wool Autocrat Going to Make the Experiment of Permitting Them to Assist Him in the Business of Government—Has Traveled Much, and is Wise for an Oriental—Has Seen Advantages of a Representative Government.

Recent events in Persia must have interested sadly with the pessimistic theories of those who have been asking so long and so pathetically, "Can any good come out of Asia?" Muzafer-ed-Din, shah-in-shah—which seems to mean king of kings—has granted a constitution to his people. Incredible as it may seem, this bred in the bone, dyed-in-the-wool autocrat has yielded to the rather crudely defined wishes of the "Thousand and One Nights."

The shah is also the possessor of three famous thrones, all in his Tcheran palace. The most wonderful of all, though possibly not the most historic, is the so-called "peacock" throne of Delhi, but recent research seems to establish the fact that it is of Persian construction. The real East Indian throne of Delhi, which was badly damaged before it was taken to Persia, is also to be seen in this storehouse of marvels. Scarcely less precious than the others is the marble throne of Kerim Khan Zand. It does not resemble in any way the western conception of a throne, but consists of an elevated platform surrounded by a pierced marble balustrade.
