FATE OF FORTUNES.

onen would be but \$125,000, even it the original fortune were to remain unimpaired; but out of sixteen children it is certain that at least one-half would be improvident, especially if born to a fortune. So it is safe to say that by the end of the second generation the fortune of \$2,000,000 would have dwindled to \$1,000,000, and that a third generation would see the money scattered far and wide.

America has presented thus far but two America has presented thus far but two exceptions to this rule, in the families of he Astors and the Vanderbilts, and the ime has not yet fully run to say with cerainty that they are exceptions. But even free proposition as a general truth hat great fortunes can not be held together for a very long period, but will become proken up and scattered, returning to the general mass of the wealth of the country from which they have been segregated.

Of course the absence of the law of pringeniture and of the law of entail makes

Of course the absence of the law of primogeniture and of the law of entail makes this dissolution of fortune more probable in the United States than it would be where those laws prevail. In Great Britain landed estates descended from generation to generation because so strictly entailed that successive holders have what in reality is only a life interest in the land and only one child takes that. With us entail is practically unknown, and public sentiment, and in some States the law itself, insists upon a division among all the children, so that it is impracticable to transmit real property as it is transmitted under English law. This does away with any danger of a landed aristocracy, and insures the ultimate distribution of the land among the people.

Again, there is a common fallacy about great fortunes which often leads to confusion. A man, Jay Gould, for example, is spoken of as being worth \$50,00,000 or \$75,000,000 and we picture him to ourselves as sitting in front of his strong box and gloating on a mass of gold coin which he has withdrawn from circulation, and which he might throw into the ocean if he pleased. The fact is that his wealth is represented in the main by certain printed or written pieces of paper called stocks and bonds, having a certain negotiable value, but each one of these pieces of paper, while it represents a certain monthly or annual income for its holder, also represents avenues of industry for hundreds and thousands of the American people, to whom the greatest calamity that could be fail them would be Jay Gould's failure and bankruptcy.

Even then the old tuskers seem loath to leave, and grunt their rage and champ their foaming jaws at the fugitive, while their malicious little eyes fairly snap with expressions of ferceity.

New Signal of Distress New Signal of Distress.

A new nautisal distress signal has been successfully experimented within England, the notable feature in this device being that no stick is required and there is no back fire, the rocket taking the form of a metal cylinder, in the base of which is the metal cylinder, in the base of which is the charge of tenite, and above this being the charge of tenite, and above this again a star composition. The propelling charge is fired by simply pulling a lanyard, and the signal is propelled upward at one impulse until the rocket has reached the maximum height, which is six hundred feet. The stars are thrown out, giving a brilliant illumination, and the tonite charge then explodes, the noise of the explosion being equal to the firing of a six-pound gun, but being high up it is heard at a great distance.
