

DRIVE TO SAVE RUSSIA FROM REDS

Ex-Communist Leader Quits Communism After Seeing Russia's Despair.

New York, Feb. 16--- An anti-Bolshevist meeting was held in Webster Hall yesterday, to hear Morris Gordon tell "Why I lost my faith in Communistic Russia," Dr. S. Ingermann, Chairman of the Russian Social Democracy of New York, presided.

The meeting was the beginn ing of a movement that it is intended to expand into national and international prctests against conditions affect ing the Russian people under the political rule of the successors of Lenineand Trotsky.

The hall, inside and out, was well guarded by the police who had been called upon by the organizers of the meeting when they heard that Communist groups had threaten d trouble. Gordon, a former Communist leader here and in Russia, had a body-guard of a dozen friends and severa detectives. Admission was by card or personal identification but managers of the meeting said some of their political enemies had evaded the scrutiny and mingled with the crowd. The audience applauded every present conditions in Russia and there seemed to be untoward, "a republic of the United States of Russia."
