Continued from our last REPORT

Of the Road and Bridge Committee.

Members—Messrs. Ryan, Wallace, Mitchell, Miller and Hill. James Hill, Esq., in the Chair.

Your Committee having examined the several documents submitted for their consideration, beg leave to report as follows:

1. 2 and 3 Correspondence between the Warden and the Commissioners of the Canada Company, from which it appears that the Canada Company claim the lands adjoining the Harbour, and that they will resist the erection of a Draw Bridge there, as recommended at the last meeting of Council—we would therefore advise the abandonment of the project.

2. The County Surveyor's Report, which appears to be satisfactory.

The 11th Section of the above refers to the general insufficiency of the leading County Roads—with regard to which we can only at present recommend, that the several Townships should expend the sudden breach appropriation of ten pounds in repairing the worst places.

Your Committee would also advise the adoption of the County Surveyor's recommendation with regard to the Bridge across the Thames at Mitchell, and that he be instructed to proceed with the erection of a new bridge accordingly.

Your Committee consider that the plan of a Bridge over the Maitland, submitted by the County Surveyor, and accompanying his report, cannot be adopted, on account of its expense, it being nearly equal to that of a Suspension Bridge—Your Committee would rather advise the adoption of the plan heretofore presented of a Suspension Bridge with one pier in the centre, and for which tenders have already been received.

52 Motion of Mr. Hill relating to the Mitchell Bridge. The same deliverance as on the part of the Surveyor's Report referring to the same subject.

50 Motion of Mr. Walker for a Bridge at the Sauble, we recommend for adoption on condition that sufficient guarantee be given to this Council for the making up by the inhabitants or other parties interested, such further sum as may be required to defray the cost of the erection of the said Bridge, over and above the sum of thirty-five pounds, granted for that purpose at the last session of Council.

Your Motion of Mr. Pentland, we would recommend for adoption.

45. Petition of James Hodgins and others relating to a Bridge over the Sauble River, with regard to which we would recommend that Messrs. Ryan and Corbett get the said Bridge put in a passable state of repair, and that if their account should exceed the amount authorized to be expended for sudden breaches, it be allowed to the extent of ten pounds.

All which is respectfully submitted by JAS. HILL, Chairman.
