I do, therefore, by this my Proclamation, order and direct that Sunday, the Fifteenth day of November, next; shall be observed, throughout this Colony, as a Day of Thanksgiving, as aforesaid.

And I do further order and direct that Wednesday, the Eleventh day of November, next, being Armistice Day shall be set aport and observed throughout the Colony, as a Day of Rejoicing and a Public and Bank Holi day, of which all persons concerned are hereby required to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly. Therefore, the attempt of the company to increase its rates, as indicated in the circular sent to subscribers, is illegal and what is technically known as ultra vires, that is, beond the power of the company. Before going further I would like to sugest to Mr. Murphy and his associates to give consideration to the question s to how far such an attempt to abuse forfeiture of their charter. However, that is for the moment an

Mr. Murphy informs us that the new regulations mean absolutely. nothing to them" (i.e. the majority of point out to him that it is incorrect. them, purport to increase the rates of sume that the Telephone Co., has a right to do so; and, as I have already pointed out, would indicate that the mpany takes the position that it not only has the right to increase the ratconcerned with them. I belong to the class of subscribers who for thirty years have used a telephone and have always paid for it.

I can, however, sympathise with Mr. Murphy in the matter of additional cost to our various businesses caused by the necessity of "employing collectors to harry our debtors until their bills are paid." I have no doubt that there are quite a few business men in this town who have had similar experence but I have not heard of any who have increased their charges on that

The whole situation as I view it emphasizes the necessity for a Public Utilities Board with full jurisdiction to deal with such matters. The Telephone Co., has its rights, which must be respected, and the public is in the same position. The action of the Telephone Co., in attempting to assert a right which their charter does not give them, makes me feel that the only way in which the public can be adequately protected from such a Corporation is by having them subjected to a strong intelligent and disinterested tribunal such as a Public Utilities Board would be, if properly selected.

I have again to ask my fellow telephone subscribers to wake up and copperate with me in this matter. Mr. Murphy's letter, which, in addition to admitting the absence of right in his company to increase its rates indicates that a further increase in rates is not outside the contemplation of the Company, makes it all the more necssary that a firm stand should be taken now and that this imposition should be "nipped in the bud."

I do not propose to discuss the rights or obligations of the Company towards delinquent subscribers, as I am not

Whilst I am not sufficiently informed of the technicalities of the telephone business to be able to state positively what is the ratio of expense to the number of telephones used. I must confess that Mr. Murphy's suggestion that 'increased production increased unit cost" is one which will need some demonstration before I can swallow it. I can quite understand that "as the number of subscribers grows larger capital expenditures for plant equipment must be made" but it does not at all follow that the unit cost increases. According to all the rules of economics it seems to me that the result is quite the reverse, unless indeed extravagance and inefficiency prevail. I do not for a moment suggest that such conditions obtain in the affairs of the Avalon Telephone Company. On the contrary, I understand that the greatest economy is exercised in the payment of most of the Telephone staff and I think it only fair to conclude in other directions of out-
