THE ONTARIO LABOR BUREAU

Mr. Mulock's Labor Bill Given a First Reading—Measure in the Interests of the Worker—A Labor Gazette to Be Published Monthly.

Ottawa, June 27.—The postmaster-general, who is rapidly winning laurels for the government by his excellent labor legislation, this morning introduced his conciliation bill, as it is briefly termed, and lucidly explained its purpose. One of the objects of the measure is to promote the settlement of trade disputes and differences that arise from time to time between employers and employees, and between different classes of employers, by the aid of conciliators or boards of conciliation.
