**BARRYMORE-COLT**  
**DIVORCE CONFIRMED**

Easterner Awaits Summons in Case Brought by Actress Wife.

New York, July 10.—Confirmation of the report that Miss Ethel Barrymore, the actress, is to sue for a divorce from Russell Griswold Colt, her husband of two years, was given here today while material from which Miss Barrymore's lawyers expect to prepare and file tomorrow initial papers in the action reached the city from Los Angeles, Cal. The suit is to be for absolute divorce, and will be formally contested. It will be filed in New York county. The summons and a copy of the complaint are awaited by Colt and his lawyer, who expect to receive them tomorrow or Wednesday.

Frank M. Patterson, Colt's lawyer, so declared today after being closeted for more than an hour with his client, Jack Barrymore, the theatrical star's brother, spent almost as long a time with Dittenehofer, Gerber & James, the law firm which Miss Barrymore retained. Neither Colt nor Barrymore was talkative afterward, but the defendant's lawyer was less secretive.

"No papers have been served on us yet," said Mr. Patterson, "but we are prepared to receive the summons tomorrow or Wednesday. We are simply waiting for the other side to move and until they act, we cannot, of course, go ahead with the case."

The material from which Miss Barrymore's lawyers will draw the complaint, it is reported, is in the form of one or more affidavits signed by Miss Barrymore at Los Angeles. There is but one ground on which absolute divorce may be procured in New York, but the name of the alleged co-respondent has been withheld. Mr. Patterson left tonight for Albany, not to return until Wednesday, but Colt remained in town at the Yale Club, where he may be easily reached.

Miss Barrymore is the daughter of the late Maurice and George Drew Barrymore. She scored her first theatrical success in 1895 in a company headed by John Drew, her uncle. She is 23 years old. Colt is 28 years old. At the time of his marriage it was said that he would eventually become heir with his brother to a fortune of \$10,000,000.

**LONDON COOL TO "THE PARISIENNE"**

Princess' Comedy, Produced at Royalty Theatre, Falls to Pieces.

London, July 11.—They may have liked a comedy called "The Parisienne" in Paris, but they certainly do not like it in London. Princess Barinskaya, whose stage name is Lydia Yavorsky, produced it at the Royalty Theatre, which she has taken for a season.

"The Parisienne" does not appeal to the British mind. In fact, it rather offends it, for the British theatregoer does not like to see his domestic linen washed in public.

The play consists simply of a series of quarrels between a weak and flirtatious wife and her insanely jealous lover. The dormant husband looks on placidly and sides with the lover. When it came to his insisting that his wife should be more kind to the lover, the British sense of propriety got up on its hind legs and roared.

To be sure, it was well acted, with the princess in the leading part, ably supported by Charles Bryant. Princess Barinskaya has a pretty accent and a charming stage presence, but she should take a few lessons in make-up. Mons. Henri Beque was the author of the play in the original French. The English translator carefully kept his name off the programme.

It was preceded by a one-act classical farce entitled "Pericles and Aspasia," by Mr. W. L. Courtney. Anyone without a playbill would have guessed that Mr. Bernard Shaw wrote it. The fun was a little above the heads of the persons who were not Greek scholars, and consisted in bringing ancient Athens up to date. Pericles dictated his oration to Aspasia, who rattled it out on a typewriter, while Pericles was nagged for money to pay tradesmen. Then they
