COMMITTEE REFUSES
TO QUESTION SNIDER

Toronto, April 9.—W. K. Snider, provincial license inspector was questioned by William Proudfoot, M. P. P., before the public accounts committee of the Legislature this morning, regarding rumors that he had taken part in the Canada Temperance Act elections in the counties of Peel, Huron and Welland this year. As the committee had power to deal only with the accounts of 1913, the chairman ruled that Mr. Snider should not answer the question of Mr. Proudfoot regarding anything that happened this year.

Mr. Proudfoot moved that in view of statements in the press that Mr. Snider had taken part in these elections, and had represented what he claimed the attitude of the Government, he asked the House to authorize the committee to investigate, but this motion was voted down by 9 to 4. "You can bring the matter up in the House," said G. Howard Ferguson, M. P. P.

Mr. Snider said he did not make any official inspection of the Woodbine Hotel, as there were three city inspectors.

LETTERS WITH COIN
TO BE FORWARDED

Ottawa, April 9.—The recently-issued order by the Postoffice Department that all letters containing coin which were transmitted through the mails were to be sent to the dead letter office unless registered, has been suspended.

The new regulation caused much adverse criticism throughout the country, and a day or two ago the deputy minister, Dr. Coulter, stated that amounts up to one dollar would be accepted without registration.

GRAFT CHARGES AGAINST
TOWNSHIP OFFICIALS

Embrun, Ont., April 9.—Serious charges of graft are to be made against several officials and ex-officials of the Township of Russell by Reeve Menard at a special meeting of the council to be held this evening.

The township faces a deficit of \$50,000, part of which Reeve Menard alleges has been practically stolen by certain officials and ex-officials. In this connection former Township Clerk W. J. Lowrie is now facing a charge of embezzlement.

An audit of the books of the township by two chartered accountants is alleged to have revealed that not in the past two years has a money bylaw passed by the council been recorded in the minutes; that about \$1,500 collected by the department for the registration of births, marriages and deaths is not accounted for, and that irregularities have been going on in the assessment department. Reeve Menard will apply for a judicial investigation.

ALASKA WOMEN HELPED
TO DECIDE ELECTIONS

Seattle, Wash., April 9.—Women helped decide elections in Alaska this week, according to dispatches received today. It was the first time women had voted in Alaska since enfranchisement by the Territorial Legislature a year ago.

In Skagway campaigning brought victory to the feminine politicians. Electors were taken to polling places by women who bought cars and supplied conveyances, while explaining sample ballots. They elected the entire non-partisan ticket in Skagway, against the taxpayers faction.

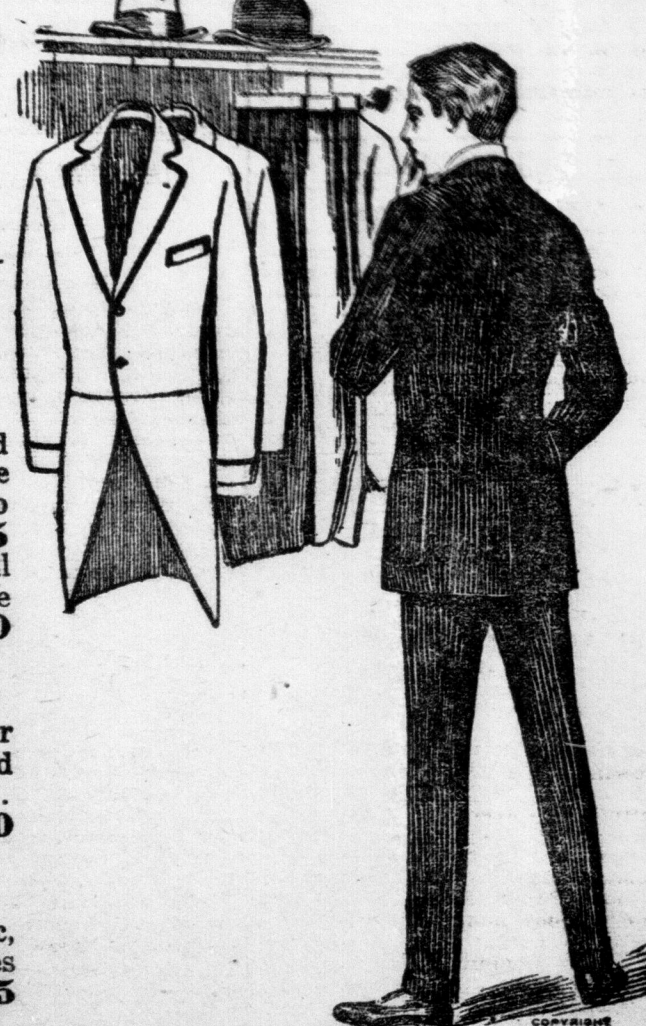
