

PARLIAMENT PROLOGUES THIS AFTERNOON

\$112,000,000 IN ESTIMATES ARE PASSED BY HOUSE IN LAST TWO HOURS OF ALL-NIGHT SESSION

Voting of Supply Was Slow Procedure Up Until Half Past Three This Morning. When Work Was Speeded Up To Limit—Questions of a Really Contentious Kind Are Passed On To Next Session.

Ottawa, June 4.—(Canadian Press)—After an all-night sitting the House of Commons adjourned at half-past 3 o'clock this morning, with the work of the session practically completed. No definite announcement in regard to prorogation was made on adjournment, but it was stated in the corridors that it would take place at 4 or 5 o'clock this afternoon.
