Takes Measure To Relieve Coast Province Agent General diers' Settlement Act.

Associated Press Despatch. London, Sept. 13. - F. C. Wade, agent-general for British Columbia in London, writes to the London Times, pointing out the disappointing results tencing them. She has been intrusted of the soldier settlement act in Canada, so far as British ex-soldiers are concerned, despite its generous provisions.
