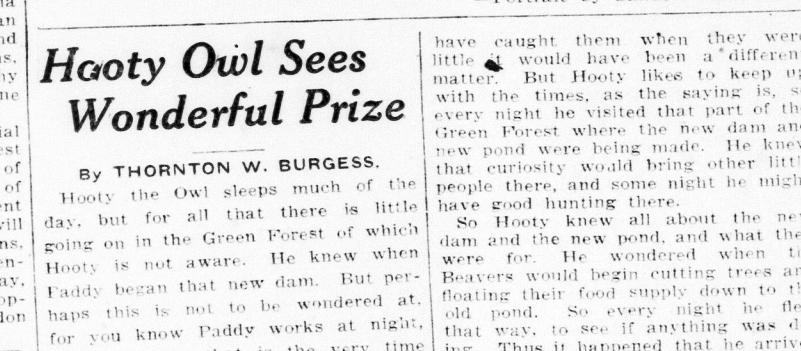

The choir of the Cronyn Methodist church, under the leadership of Mrs. E. O'Dell, will sing the hymns and the "Chorus of Angels."

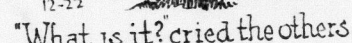
