## 8314 Voters in Northumberland

### County Rapidly Gaining in Population

There are 8314 qualified voters in the county of Northumberland for the year 1912. The returns have been completed their work and the report has been made to Mr. E. B. Willison, Secretary-treasurer. Last year there were 7619 voters in the county, 695 less than the present returns. Every parish has gained with the exception of South Esk, which has decreased 2, and Blissfield remains the same. ### BRITAIN BARS AMERICAN TRUSTS

Pending the ultimate result of the legal proceedings in the United States court into meat packing firms, it has been decided by the British government that none of the firms involved shall be invited to tender for army supplies.

The decision of the government is due to the opposition of labor and the advance Radicals of Parliament to the American trusts. The contracts are now expected to go to Argentine packers.

### REFORMS SOUGHT BY LABOR DELEGATES

Ottawa Jan. 7.—The Dominion Trades and Labor delegates are to meet the government to-morrow with numerous requests for reform. Among them are: Allowing musicians to play on Sunday, one day off in seven for waiters and waitresses, exclusion of Asiatics and insistence that all immigrants have \$25 in cash on landing, eight-hour day and in case for letter carrier, eight-hour day in public works and adoption of the federal department of public health, abolition of the senate, 10¢ night pay of railway employees, opposition to bounty on steel, etc., more practical enforcement of alien labor law and government inspection of locomotive boilers.

## A YORK CO. MYSTERY

Since one day last week a strange dog has remained continuously near a hole in the ice of the northeast branch of the Nashwaak stream, York Co., about two or three miles above the Estey Bridge. All efforts to get the animal to leave the place have proven fruitless, and the dog also refuses to make up with anybody or pay them any attention, and it is believed that his master, who might have been gone through the hole in the ice and lost his life. The water at the place is about four or five feet deep and the stream is swift and would quickly carry away anybody who might have gone through the ice. There is no solution of the mystery.

The mystery which was caused at the head waters of the Nashwaak stream by the dog which insisted on remaining near an air hole in the ice and which gave the people in the locality the impression that the animal was owned by a hunter who had probably been drowned there, has been solved. The dog is the property of Samuel Seymour of McLeod Hill, and is thought to be suffering from some form of hydrophobia, which causes it to follow the brook and remain at the air holes for hours at a time. The owner of the dog has been notified and if he doesn't take possession of the animal at once it will be shot.

### MORE PERSIANS HANGED: REIGN OF TERROR IN TABRIZ

Teheran, Jan. 5.—Besides the Sikad el Islam whose position corresponds to that of an archbishop, three leading divines and all the principal members of the Ashurani, a tribal assembly, were publicly hanged by Russians at Tabriz.

All the Armenian shops there were looted and a reign of terror has begun. The officials of the revenue of flocks fled for refuge to the English imperial Bank.

At Reht the same programme was carried out, but in a less extreme form. The Governor, the Chief of Police and the heads of the municipal government have been sent into exile. "Suspects" are being arrested in large numbers, court martialled and shot or imprisoned.
