Mr. Meredith, the leader of the tion, opened the ball yesterday. He began by good humoredly rallying the mover of passing on to reply to Mr. Hay, he deprecated the introduction of Dominion politics into the legislature. If the ministry, how ever, desired to make the national policy a battle-ground, certainly the opposition would not have cause to complain. Had the mover of the address had any regard for the feelings of his friend, the member for Lincoln, he would not have ventured on his tirade on the N. P., for that gentleman, Mr. Neelon, had repeatedly declared his approval of the N. P. Notwithstanding Mr. Hay's denial the benefits of protection were patent on every hand, and many of the reform organs seeing the folly of longer trying to convince the people to the contrary, were backing down from their former hostility. With reference to the boundary question, hon. gentlemen seemed to forget that Ontario, though only a province of the

Dominion, was premier province and consequently more deeply interested than anyother in the welfare of the Dominion as a whole. The opposition would not shrink from taking just and patriotic ground on this and all other questions, but would not and could not echo the violent and inflamatory language used by the mover of the address. He charged that the course of the government evinced not so much a desire to maintain the rights of Ontario as to make political capital for their friends at Ottawa. The proper course to have pursued would have been to make a dignified protest


