Clarke Wallace moved the second reading of his bill to amend the Act for the Prevention and Suppression of Combinations. It amends the act by striking out the words "unduly" and "unreasonably," applied to the degree of restraint exercised by the combination, and by repealing section 6 and substituting this clause: "The foregoing provisions of this act shall not apply to the exercise of any handicraft ar to the performance of labor, and subject to such exception they shall be construed as if section 22 of the Trades Union Act had not been enacted." These amendments, he said, would make the act effective.

Mr. Barron maintained that the words "unduly" and "unreasonably" might be struck out and yet the statute be ineffective because the word "unlawfully" was allowed to remain in the act.
