Gordon Brown Speaks Out. "What is your position on the Sunday street car question?" asked The World of Mr. Gordon Brown yesterday morning. "I am strongly in favor of them," replied

"I am strongly in favor of them," replied Mr. Brown. "The World has placed the matter in a shape that suits me well. I am it anxious to know how it is that while every-one in the city is welcome to use his own rig and coachiman, or to hire livery rics by the hundred if they want them, yet they must not use the street cars. It is absurd, and for a certain portion of the people to attempt to maintain this condition by using religious arguments is nothing short of atrocious. "Take my own case," continued Mr. I Brown "In going to church on Sunday I am forced to hire a rig at a cost of about \$75. a year. If street cars were running I could am forced to hire a rig at a cost of about \$75. a year. If street cars were running I could go down to church for four cents and back for the same. Why should 1 not? As it is now I hire a man and a horse for my own personal needs, whereas I have seen one iman and one borse run along with a street car containing 34 peoule." "That's a striking way of putting it," said The World.

World. It's the sensible way. If it is a sin to employ Sunday labor unnecessarily, then the greater sin is to make the labor of a man and a team serve the needs of convenience of one individual only. Every man who is unable to walk to church must, if he has means, employ as much labor as would be neans, empioy as much labor as would be required to run a one-horse car-or, having no ineans, he must stay at home.
