### THE PARNELLITES SECURE

#### REDMOND MAKES FORMAL DEMANDS ON THE LIBERALS.

Unless Parliament considers the Evicted Tenant Question and retrocudes Home Rule the Parnellites of Gladstone's Majority Will Go Over to the Opposition.

LONDON, Oct. 23.—John Redmond, M.P. for Waterford, in a speech at Cork this evening, said that the Nationalist party was divided into two sections, each of which had the other worse than they did the members of the Parnellite section.

Notwithstanding the promises made by the Liberal party in their majority when they found that, after years of Liberal rule, the doors were doubly locked upon political prisoners. Not only this, but the question of evicted tenants was shirked and shelved and the matter of Home Rule indefinitely postponed.

Price of the Parnellite support. The votes of the Independent party, counting 18, on a division could not be despised by a party with only 30,000 of only 38, and Mr. Redmond said he would now give formal notice to the Liberal whip that they could no longer count on the Parnellites.

It would be difficult, he says, to imagine that any class of the community would be so ready to oppose to Gladstone's reinstatement of the Home Rule bill, that matter being one of the first conditions of permanent peace in Ireland.
