in this part of the land. As you are about to go and visit my poor brethren, the Western tribes of Indians, I pray the Lord Jesus, our God, will prosper and protect you on your journey thither, and bless your endeavours to preach the Gospel of Christ amongst them. I hope you will be the means of the conviction and conversion of many poor inhabitants of the wilderness.

I am glad that the Lord our God has put into the hearts of the Americans to fend Missionaries amongst the Indians. I am likewise very thankful, that the Affociation of New-York thinks of us yet in this town. Dear brother, I beg of you, that you would inform the Miffion Society, that I give them a thoufand thanks, that they have taken up fuch honourable work in fending a Miffionary amongst my poor benighted brethren in the wilderness. As they now begin, I hope they will keep on that good work; I fay good work: yes, I believe it is honourable and commenda-I hope and pray, that their endeavours, to spread the Gospel of Christ amongst my heathen brethren, will be bleit
