The thanks of the Synod were then tendered to the joint committees on Union; and Presbyteries were directed to consider what change may be necessary in the arrangement of Presbyteries, and to report at

next meeting of Synod. On motion it was unanimously agreed :---" That the cordial thanks of this Synod be given to the ministers, sessions, and people of our congregations in the city of St. John, and in Carleton, for their great hospitality to members of this Synod; and to the congregations of St. John's and St. David's, for the use of their churches; also to the managers of the St. John's Reading Room for the privileges of the room; and to the owners and managers of the steamers and railways, for the accommodation afforded by them."

Agreed further that the thanks of Synod be given to Wm. Wedder-'in Mr. Wedburn, Esq., barrister, for advice given to the joint committee on union and for the interest manifested by him in the questions on which he was consulted.

> The moderator then read the 122d Psalm, of which the three closing verses were sung. Rev. George Christie, by request, offered prayer, The moderator pronounced the benediction, having previously declared the Synod adjourned, to meet on the fourth Tuesday of June, 1867, and at 7 o'clock, P.
