The building was erected for the Montreal High School, and has been adapted to the use of the Normal School with as little change of plan as nossible.

It is heated by three furnaces in the basement, in which is also a residence for the porter.

The model schools are scated with double desks and chairs, on the Boston plan, for 200 children. The Normal school class rooms are seated in a similar manner, each with chairs for 50 teachers in training. The

tation rooms are furnished with galleries and benches, and all the class rooms are provided with large surfaces of wall blackboard.
