is clayey subsul, obtained from I op diggings, well dried and sifted, entirely free from all sand, grit, of froign matter. The wound is first covered with waxed paper or gauze and colledion, and then a layer of clay, and over this a roller bindage. The author claims that the earth is not only a disinfectant, but also has a soothing and cooling offect when thus applied to the wound and the healing process takes place mare kindly and rapidly
