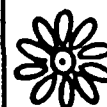

Davis, Richard Harding. "The Bar Sinister." Colored illustrations, \$1.00. A new edition of this charming story of dog life.

Field, Eugene. "Poems of Childhood." Illustrated in colors, \$2.50. The text of this sumptuous volume consists of all the poems in the two volumes, "With Trumpet and Drum" and "Love Songs of Childhood," with one or two poems from other books by Mr. Field.
