The presents its compliments to the and has the honour to propose the conclusion of the following arrangement between the Government of Canada and the Government of for the employment of dependents.

The two governments agree that, on the basis of reciprocity, dependents of employees of one Government assigned to official duty in the other country as members of a diplomatic mission, members of a consular post, or members of a mission to an international organization will receive authorization to accept employment in the receiving State. No restriction will be placed on the type of employment that may be undertaken. It is understood, however, that in professions where particular qualifications are required, it will be necessary for the dependent to meet those qualifications. Further, authorization to accept employment may be denied in cases where, for security reasons, only nationals of the receiving State may be employed.

For the purposes of this arrangement, "employee(s)" means diplomatic and consular personnel, other government personnel attached to diplomatic and consular missions and administrative, technical and support staff. "Dependent(s)" means: (a) spouses; (b) unmarried dependent children under 21,
