Budget, 1846. Discrimination in taxation as between privately-owned and publicly-owned utility companies; exemption from income tax of publicly-owned utility companies; municipally-owned utility companies; equity in taxation may be brought about by abolishing the income tax on public utilities; gross revenue from sale of electricity in Canada, 1846; adoption by the government of protective features of Conservative policy; countervailing duties; omissions from budget speech; loss of taxation will mean a deficit for current fiscal year; no evidence of economy in main estimates; sales tax, 1847; enlargement of preferential tariff; past policies of Liberal party; reciprocity with United States; Sir Richard Cartwright in 1891 on unrestricted reciprocity with United States; Conservative party and reciprocity within the British empire; reciprocity agreement of 1911; unstable principles of Liberal party, 1848; trade with Great Britain and the United States; preference to Canadian products; iron and steel schedules; preference for Canadians in the Canadian market; removal of the duty on tea, 1849; operating loss and deficit on Canadian Government Merchant Marine; increasing subsidies to merchant marine, 1849; an election budget, 1850
